“The Naked Dream” explores why nudity continues to spark controversy. Some fight public nudity, equating it with depravity. Others fight for the right to be naked everywhere. Most of us experience a mixture of shame and freedom while naked. Into the mix comes body anxiety, fear of sexual violence, exhibitionism and plain old prudence.

In this documentary, award-winning filmmaker Jan Dalchow digs deeper. When people overcome their fears and go naked, why do most people feel so good about it? Among his subjects are people afraid of and proud of their naked bodies, some of them portrayed in “1000BodiesProject.”

1000BODIESPROJECT



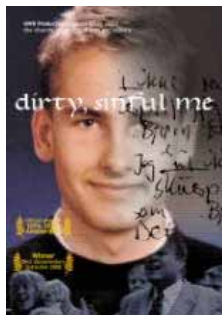

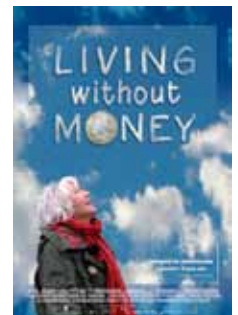
